

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#### **PREFACE**

Taking a postgraduate course is a great honour and responsibility. Having achieved certain results in university studies, the students set new educational goals and expand their academic backgrounds. The postgraduate course requires doing a multifaceted scientific study, and students conclude their research writing reports and theses, presenting the findings at conferences or workshops. It is for these purposes that academic language should be used.

Academic English Glossary is aimed at researchers who begin writing their qualification papers in English and strive for sound reasoning and comprehensive account of study outcome that can be delivered to international audience.
